

CANADIAN COMMITTEE ON CATALOGUING SUSAN JONES (CALL/ACBD LIAISON TO THE COMMITTEE)

Activities since Conference: Since submitting my annual report to CALL/ACBD in mid-April 2023, the Canadian Committee on Cataloguing (CCC) met on May 25, 2023 and September 14, 2023:

- to receive updates from the representative from Library and Archives Canada (LAC) on the
 revision of Canadian Subject Headings and the PS8000 classification schedule to better
 reflect terminology used by First Nations, Inuit and the Métis Nation; participation in the
 National Indigenous Knowledge and Languages Alliance's work on the development of the
 Respectful Terminology Platform Project; and creation of a publicly-available wiki space for
 LAC's policies, classification schedules, and other documentation;
- to receive updates from the CCC Chair about the Resource Description & Access (RDA)
 Steering Committee (RSC), including its timeline to close the original RDA Toolkit; making the RSC's RDA Education and Orientation Officer a permanent position to address the need for ongoing training and education; and survey on soft-deprecated elements; and
- to discuss the RSC's proposal to add carrier type values for pre-recorded chips on Playaway devices; the Religions Working Group's proposal to revise term of rank, honour, or office; and the Place/Jurisdiction Working Group's proposal to revise the labels and definitions of corporate body: jurisdiction governed and place: jurisdiction governed of.

Ongoing activities/new special projects: The CCC will meet next in November 2023.
