Is your hotel room booked?

You can reserve your conference hotel room today at our special rate by visiting the conference website <u>accommodations</u> <u>page</u>. Our special rate at the Westin Bayshore is \$209, a \$90 savings per night! The CALL room block will be released to the general public on Sunday, April 17th so book today! CALL negotiates rates with hotels that are much lower than published rates. We recognize that it is sometimes possible to book a room using discount travel sites that can undercut our rate. However, if a reservation is made outside of the systems described on our accommodations page, we do not get credit for having booked your room. CALL must pay for unused guest rooms, so, as a result, we could be responsible for costly attrition penalties to our contracted hotel.
