This is a friendly reminder of the upcoming MLIS Fall 2019 Co-op process, for those thinking of hiring a co-op student this fall.

#### **Returning Employers with Career Central Accounts**

Returning employers with <u>Career Central accounts</u> can login either a) submit a new job posting or b) update their previous posting(s). Once the "new" / "revised" posting has been submitted and approved, it will go live on the co-op job board (starting on June 3, 2019) for the preferred posting duration.

#### **New to Career Central?**

If you are new to Career Central, please complete our <u>employer application form</u> and submit a co-op job posting to the <u>co-op office</u> (including details about the placement such as duties, skills required, pay rate, contact person to whom the students should address their applications). All new positions will go through an approval process prior to posting. Once approved, an employer account will be created for you on our site. This site has been designed to centralize and streamline the administrative elements of our co-op process.
