Hire Master of Information Co-op Students!

A number of students in the [Master of Information Co-op Program](#) at The University of Toronto are still actively looking for Summer and/or Fall 2018 opportunities in the field of information science! Particularly, students in the Information Systems & Design as well as the User Experience Design concentrations are on the hunt for exciting opportunities in areas related to data analytics, user experience and information management.

To qualify as a co-op work term, the role should be:

- A minimum of 12 consecutive weeks and up to 4 months; an 8-month work term is also an option
- Full-time (i.e. minimum of 35 hours a week)
- Paid; \$18 – \$28 per hour (suggested)
- Relevant work experience appropriate for a graduate student
- A positive and productive learning experience for the student
