

Nomination Deadlines Fast Approaching!

Applications are open for the <u>Denis Marshall Memorial Award for Excellence in Law Librarianship</u>. The Marshall Award is bestowed on a current member of CALL/ABCD who has provided outstanding service to the Association AND/OR enhanced the profession of law librarianship in the recent past. Nominations for this award are to be accompanied by two signed letters of support as well as three additional names. Applications are requested by **April 1, 2023**.

Applications are also open for the <u>Michael Silverstein Prize</u>, the <u>Gisèle Laprise Prize</u>, <u>Nancy</u> <u>McCormack Award</u> and the <u>Education Reserve Fund</u>. Hugh Lawford Award 2023 Nominations Open

CALL/ACBD is accepting nominations for the 2023 Hugh Lawford Award for Excellence in Legal Publishing.

The Canadian Association of Law Libraries has long had an annual award for excellent legal publishing. Some years ago, we renamed the award we present after Queens University Professor Hugh Lawford (1933-2009) to recognize his contributions to legal publishing in Canada. As a group of legal information specialists, our work depends on being able to access and share high-quality legal knowledge.

We value innovation and this award is open to legal content in all information formats.

The award honours a publisher (whether for-profit or not-for profit, corporate or non-corporate) that has demonstrated excellence by publishing a work, series, website, or electronic product that makes a significant contribution to legal research and scholarship.

Members and non-members of CALL/ACBD are welcome to make nominations. Information about the process is available on our <u>website</u>.

Below are instructions to help you post your opportunities on Symplicity, our in-house recruitment platform for Co-op positions.

Symplicity Employer Login or Account Creation

Create an Account:

Go to Sign in (symplicity.com). You may want to bookmark this page.

Click "Sign In" if you already have an account and select "Forgot Password" if needed.

Click "Sign Up" if you do not have an account. This means your company may have an account but you as a Contact don't have an account and have never logged into the system.

- Find your organization and complete your Contact information. Note that we already have organizations in the system. Please try a few ways to search to ensure yours is a new organization before creating a new organization record.
- If your organization is NOT listed, type in the full name of your organization and complete your account information. At this time, you can also post your position for our students to view.
- Once your account and posting(s) have been approved, you will be notified within 3 business days and you will be able to access your account, post your position, and view applications.

Please note that there are two approval stages – the Company/Contact account approval and the Posting approval.

Posting your positions on Symplicity:

1. Posting a position is free. Once your account is approved, simply sign in and click 'Post a Position', from the left menu of the Home screen.

2. We suggest a two-week application window for the 2023 recruitment cycle.

3. On the posting page:

- Select 'MI Co-op' for the Position Type and Applicant Type.
- Select 'Summer 2023' (May to September) for the Work Term. If you are posting an 8month opportunity, please select "Summer + Fall 2023"
- Complete the form and click 'Submit'. Positions will be reviewed and approved within 3 business days. You will receive an approval confirmation email.

Coordinating Interviews & Presenting Offers:

Feel free to coordinate interviews directly with applicants. If you make an offer, please copy your Engagement Coordinator (Cat or Sana) in case they can support the offer process in any way. This will also ensure we finalize the required paperwork and update our records on our end.
