On October 15, 2020 the Supreme Court of Canada granted leave to appeal in the York University v. Canadian Copyright Licensing Agency ("Access Copyright") <u>fair dealing case</u>. The CALL Copyright Committee is looking the possibility of CALL/ACBD intervening, given the final outcome may have huge implications for many institutions.
